Health Services

Healthcare Access for the Low Income and Uninsured Samuel Dixon Family Health Center, Inc. (661) 468-7405

This program provides primary medical services, immunization, quality outpatient care, pediatrics, women's health, school physicals, family planning, laboratory services, and referral services to lowand moderate-income persons.

Housing

Handyworker Program Santa Clarita Valley Committee on Aging Corp. (661) 259-9444

This program provides grants up to \$5,000 to income-qualified homeowners for minor home repairs and rehabilitation services to upgrade the condition of their homes.

Handyworker Program Antelope Valley Partners for Health (661) 942-4719

This program provides for minor home repairs and addresses minor code deficiencies by offering income-qualified households a grant of approximately \$2,500 to address safety and habitability needs and provide minor home repairs.

Handyworker Program

Los Angeles County Development Authority (626) 586-1828

This program provides up to \$9,000 grants for minor home repairs to eligible low-and moderateincome (80% AMI and below) households within the following Fifth Supervisorial District unincorporated areas: Acton, Agua Dulce, Altadena, Angeles National Forest, Arcadia, Bradbury, Canyon Country, Castaic, Charter Oak, Claremont, Covina, East Pasadena, Hi Vista, Kagel Canyon, La Crescenta/Montrose, Lake Hughes, Lake Los Angeles, Leona Valley, Littlerock, Llano, Newhall, North East San Gabriel, North Lancaster, Pearblossom, Quartz Hill, Roosevelt, San Pasqual, South Antelope Valley, Stevenson Ranch, Universal City, Val Verde, and Valencia.

Special Needs and Senior Services

Senior Grant Program Los Angeles County Development Authority (626) 586-1814 This program provides funding for rehabilitation assistance in the form of a grant of up to \$25,000 to low- and moderate-income senior homeowners located in the unincorporated areas of the Fifth District.

Wildifre Recovery – Senior Programs (Loma Alta Park) Los Angeles County Aging & Disabilities Department (213) 291-0028

This new project provides assistance to seniors in the Altadena area who have been affected by the Eaton wildfires of January 2025. The funds will assist the Elderly Nutrition Program in providing meals and fund the purchasing of kitchen equipment needed to serve this local community impacted by the wildfire at the new Loma Alta County Park and Recreations congregate meal location in the City of Altadena.

Home Visitation Program Antelope Valley Partners for Health (661) 942-4719

This program provides preventative, routine, evidence-based home visitation support which emphasizes child and family health, safety, nutrition, and parenting education sessions to at-risk adults who are either pregnant or who recently delivered a child.

Senior Programs

Senior Programs (Stephen Sorensen Park) County of Los Angeles, Department of Parks and Recreation (626) 588-5250

This project provides for a senior program, to include nutrition, at Stephen Sorensen Park, for persons 60 years and over.

Senior Programs (Jackie Robinson Park) County of Los Angeles, Department of Parks and Recreation (626) 588-5250

This project provides for a senior activities program at Jackie Robinson Park.

Wildfire Recovery – Vans for Transporting Seniors (Loma Alta Park) County of Los Angeles, Department of Parks and Recreation (626) 588-5294

These vans will enable program staff to provide much-needed transportation services, ensuring that seniors who may have difficulty traveling to the park can still take full advantage of the enriching activities offered.

Youth Programs
